CYCU Microsoft Azure Teaching Subsidy Project

Approved on March 23, 2021, during the 2nd Office of Academic Affairs meeting of the spring semester of the 2023 academic year.

I. Project Objective

With the rapid development of technology, using cloud platforms for computational solutions to enterprise problems has become a global trend. To equip students with the latest knowledge in cloud services, the university has introduced the Microsoft Azure platform, providing cloud resource credits for course usage. This initiative aims to cultivate students' logical thinking, computational thinking, problem-solving skills, and innovative thinking capabilities.

II. Eligibility

Full-time faculty members of the university may apply for subsidies for up to two X+P/A courses per semester (courses must incorporate "Programming" or "Artificial Intelligence"). Course plans must include the integration of Microsoft Azure cloud platform resources.

III. Application Period

Implemented each semester according to the i-touch announcement date. Applying faculty members must submit the application form, signed by their department heads, along with the "Course Syllabus" to the Center for Learning Enhancement of Academic Affairs Office before the deadline.

IV. Subsidy Amounts

Each course is eligible for a subsidy of 10,000 Azure platform credits. For additional needs, a detailed explanation must be provided, and the designated contact at the Student Learning Development Center of the Academic Affairs Office must be consulted.

V. Review Criteria

The Student Learning Development Center of the Academic Affairs Office will review and approve the number of courses and Azure platform credits to be granted.

VI. Subsidy Period

During the offering period of the approved subsidized courses.

VII. Subsidy Obligations

Faculty members whose courses are subsidized must provide a report detailing the Azure platform packages used and the problems addressed at the end of the course.
