- Article 1 According to Article 8 of the Enforcement Rules of the University Act and Article 45 of the Chung Yuan Christian University (hereinafter referred to as CYCU) Academic Regulations, in response to national key industry policies, utilizing the teaching resources of various colleges and departments, and establishing practical cross-college and cross-department programs to enhance students' interdisciplinary abilities and employment competitiveness, CYCU Implementation Guidelines for the Interdisciplinary Credit Program (hereinafter referred to as "the Guidelines") are hereby formulated.
- Article 2 The total number of credits for the "Interdisciplinary Credit Programs" (hereinafter referred to as "Interdisciplinary Programs") shall not be less than 12 credits and shall be capped at 16 credits. However, the Program applying for external funding is not subject to this limitation.
- Article 3 The application and study regulations for the Interdisciplinary Programs are as follows:
 - 1. Students from all grades and programs at CYCU can apply to enroll in Interdisciplinary programs. Once selected and approved, these students will have priority in choosing courses within the Interdisciplinary Programs.
 - 2. Each Program may conduct selection operations based on actual conditions. If the number of students selecting the Program does not meet the minimum class size, the class may be merged with other classes.
 - 3. If necessary, related courses may be offered during winter and summer vacations,

- and students shall pay credit fees according to regulations.
- 4. The credits earned from the Program may be counted towards graduation credits. Students who have not completed the required credits of the Interdisciplinary Programs may not use this as a reason to delay graduation. Students who have not completed the required credits of the Interdisciplinary Programs may apply to complete them within 5 years after graduation by attending classes with current students, but the course requirements at the time of obtaining the Interdisciplinary Programs certificate shall prevail.
- 5. Students who have completed the required courses and credits of the Interdisciplinary Programs shall be issued a Program certificate upon graduation after verification by the responsible unit of the Interdisciplinary Programs and confirmation by the Office of Academic Affairs.
- 6. Graduated students who have not completed the required credits of the Interdisciplinary Programs may not make any requests other than for a transcript.
- Article 4 If the Interdisciplinary Programs need to be terminated for any reason, assistance shall be provided to students currently enrolled in the Interdisciplinary Programs to complete related course selection matters.
- Article 5 The Guidelines shall be implemented after being passed by the Academic Affairs Meeting, announce and implement after the president's approval. Any amendments shall follow the same procedure.
