Article 4 Department Rule Governing Bachelor Program

- A. The required courses must in principle take in the same class within the department, the lower class cannot take required courses in higher class except those approved through the administrative procedure.
- B. The score is not above 50 for department required courses Economics (I) and Statistics (I) cannot take Economics (II) and Statistics (II); those take Money and Banking (I) before and without termination can take Money and Banking (II).
- C. The required courses offered in summer session do not open for first-time (termination included) student to undertake; the rule applied for other department taking International Business as minor and double major students.
- D. The extended elective course in General Education must include the college special course "Business Ethics."
- Article 5 All other relevant matters not covered in these policies shall be governed by the "CYCU Academic Policies" and relevant regulations.
- Article 6 This guideline has been carried out the review of the Academic Affairs Meeting. Any revision to this guideline will follow the same procedures.

## Instruction :

## I. The School Regulations :

- A. The "KQ-Sciences" and "IQ-Literature & Rhetoric" in the General Education Program are mandatory and must be completed during the freshman year. Regarding the "IQ-Literature & Rhetoric" courses, the <u>Chinese Literature Classics</u> should be taken during the first semester of the freshman year, while the <u>Literacy and Rhetoric</u> should be taken during the second semester of the freshman year."
- B. The General Education elective courses are divided into four categories: GQ-The Creator, EQ-Humanity, KQ-The Entire Creation, and IQ-The Individual Self. At least two credits must be taken in each category, with a total of 12 credits required to fulfill the requirement.
- C. The Computer Information Related courses, which must have a minimum of 2 credits, should include instructional content on programming design or programming language application. Additionally, at least one-third of the total teaching hours should be devoted to this topic. The

courses aim to cultivate students' abilities in logical thinking, logical operation, and the use of technology for innovative learning.

- D. From the 101 academic years, undergraduate students are required to pass the English proficiency test recognized by the school to be eligible for graduation.
- E. From the academic year of 2014 onwards, fifth-year high school students are required to take an additional 6 credits both for general education courses and professional courses.
- F. Students enrolled in bachelor's degree programs are required to take 2 EMI courses before graduation. [Excluding English (I)&(II), English Listening and Speaking in Lab (I)&(II), Practical English (I)&(II) and Business School Business English Conversation (I)&(II), Skills for English Language Testing (except for ALLS students)]
- G. The scope of other elective courses includes minor, double major, Interdisciplinary Course Program, Employment Program, Micro Program (including from other departments), PBL courses, MOOCs micro-credit courses (1 credit per course, up to a maximum of 6 credits), and Profession Self-Directed Learning (up to 2 credits).
- H. For the courses and grades issues, please consult the related regulations according to "CYCU Academic Policies".

## II. Graduation Regulations of the Department :

- A. The general education course must include the college special course "Business Ethics" in order to graduate.
- B. Starting 2018-2019 academic year, overseas Grade 5 graduates need to add 6 credits in general education and 6 credits in the elective course offered in the department.

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
